Burbidge, PhD, Statewide Behavioral Safety Manager (Zero Fatalities Program Director)	Zero Fatalities- A Review of the 5 Deadly Behaviors	The Zero Fatalities mission is to actively reduce high-risk driving behaviors through public awareness and targeted education, creating safer roadways in every Utah community. Targeting underlying values and attitudes is the most effective long-term strategy for transforming deeply ingrained behaviors, especially in complex areas like safety. The road to Zero Fatalities begins and ends with individual action. We all must focus on improving our consistent, daily behaviors to enhance safety in every situation. As integral components of the transportation system, every traveler, whether driving, walking, or cycling, bears the responsibility to act safely, adhere to the law, and actively look out for the well-being of others. Ultimately, every person serves as a critical element in traffic safety, and we are accountable to ourselves and each other. This session will focus on the 5 highest risk driving behaviors: drowsy driving, distracted driving, aggressive driving, impaired driving, and seat belt use. We will discuss each behavior and describe how driver education instructors can emphasize the importance of these behaviors to new drivers they teach.

From Class 3 e-bikes to high-performance electric scooters, "micro-mobility" is no longer just a trend—it's the primary way thousands of teens get to school. However, our 1990s school zone infrastructure and safety policies are struggling to keep pace with vehicles that can reach speeds of 28 mph in the hands of unlicensed minors. This roundtable session invites participants deep dive into the unique challenges of the electric era: the increased kinetic energy in crashes, the "silent speed" that catches teen drivers off guard, and the critical lack of rider education for middle and high school students.
